Celebrate Saskatchewan's Sustainability Champions

RCE Saskatchewan's 17th Annual Awards for Achievement in Education for Sustainable Development

RCE Saskatchewan's Patron, Her Honour the Honourable Bernadette McIntyre, Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan, will be presenting the awards. News media are welcome.

Join us for a unique event honouring champions in sustainability from across the province. The event will honour 45 Saskatchewan projects at a gathering focused on the [UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals](#).

We are extremely proud to be able to present several special awards. The “**Salthaven West Wildlife Rehabilitation Education Program**” by the **Salthaven West Wildlife Rehabilitation and Education Centre** will be awarded the *Excellence in Education for Sustainable Development in the Community Award*. **SaskOutdoors** will receive the *Lyle Benko Future Generations Award* for its “**Empowering Change through Climate Education and Outdoor Play**” project for outstanding Education for Sustainable Development in Kindergarten to Grade 12. **Dr Shela Hirani** of the University of Regina will receive the *Dr. Garth Pickard Award for Post-Secondary Excellence in Education for Sustainable Development* for their “**Breastfeeding Advocacy Knowledge Hub**” project.

This year's event will see the introduction of two new special awards. The **Community Governance Recognition Award** for outstanding contributions of First Nations Communities & Municipalities to the SDGs in Saskatchewan will go to **Jason Cook-Studer (Lac La Ronge Indian Band)** for their “**Pithesowiskotew Community Energy**” project. **James Whittingham's** project, “**The Clean Energy Show Podcast,**” will receive the **Energy Innovation Recognition Award** for outstanding contributions to Renewable Energy advancement and energy innovation in Saskatchewan. After the awards ceremony, the event's co-host will provide a curated tour titled “Walking the Wascana: A Land-Based Experience.”

All 45 projects being recognized educate, encourage and engage others in local action that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. All dimensions of ecological, economic, social, and cultural sustainability are represented.



This is the 17th year for the event, with more than 340 awards being presented since 2007. [RCE Saskatchewan](#) created the awards to honour Saskatchewan sustainable development leaders from businesses, towns and cities, educational institutions and community-based organizations. The RCE is a voluntary network (with founding partners including the University of Regina, University of Saskatchewan, and Saskatchewan Polytechnic), and is one of more than [190 Regional Centres of Expertise](#) on Education for Sustainable Development around the world that are formally recognized by the United Nations University. The event is held in a different community every year, this year being co-hosted by [Luther College at the University of Regina](#).

[RCE SK Co-Coordinator, Dr. Roger Petry](#) is thrilled with another record number of applicants this year. “Saskatchewan has been and continues to be a global leader in sustainable development, and the positive, creative, and focused work of all our recipients is well deserving of recognition. Each has a wonderful story to tell, and our annual awards ceremony is their opportunity to shine.”
